

Project Review

Looking back on my six units projects, I've grown so much from the beginning till now. First of all, foundation taught me to be a better researcher throughout projects we did, doing research for me is much easier than before, many new methods of developing ideas, such as going to library, art gallery for primary research, and making samples, experiencing material use as my secondary research. All these techniques can really push me to go deeper with my topic and concept. In addition, learning distinct textile techniques have lead me to the next level where I learnt I could get inspiration from 2D textile samples for my silhouette designs. Finally, through back to the past projects I did, I found that there was no project was relating to myself or my personal stories. Therefore, for this project, I strongly want to do something that can express my personal emotions. I decided to look deep into three parts of me as my inspirations, and they are: family/friends/childhood.

Project Concept & Description

In this project I will explore the connections between friends and also the ways that they are dynamic. This idea for my project was inspired by a game I played when I was young called Cat's Cradle where my friend and I used one piece of string to create different figures with our hands. I always found the different shapes and movements interesting because they reminded me of how friends can play different roles in our lives – and this is what I want to explore in my project.

I will research more games that I used to play when I was young where people have physical connections. Both where people have something to connect them (eg. String in Cat's cradle), and also connection through touch. In addition, I will also research visual language in dance and movement. I am interested in the shapes of movements people communicate with one another. For the textile research, I want to look more into distinct artist, such as Louise Bourgeois who did many textile works that relates to her childhood, so I intend to find some inspirations from her ways of transfer her personal stories into art works.

I am thinking of experimenting with new textile strategies that I've never tried on with my work before, such as, weaving, knots making and etc. I have a concept idea that I show our friendship transformed into performance art.I intent to try to make a garment that two people(me and my friend) can wear together, this could both give the wearer or viewer a feeling of protection and comfort.

Project Evaluation

I always evaluate my work with my tutors and a group of classmates to do critic, in this way, I found I could get the more feedbacks from different points of view. Even though, sometimes I don't agree with their ideas, they can still help me to think and develop my concept. In addition, doing workflow everyday helps me to refresh my process development throughout the day, so that I could reflect on the points I've been missed, as well as thinking forward on what is the next step for further development.
